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Making an APA Reference List

At the end of your paper you will have a section that is titled "References Cited". Here you will list, in alphabetical order using the author's last name, all of the references that you used in your paper. Do not list personal interviews (there is a different way to cite that within your paper). The format for references changes depending on the type of material being cited. Below is a list of the formats:

Please note the placement of . periods in the format

Also note that if there are two authors you put an & between the two, if there are more than two they are separated by commas, and the use of an & in front of the last author. Always use initials after the last name with a . period after each initial.

Article in a journal, paginated by volume:

Author last name, first initials. (Date). Article Title. *Journal Title*, volume, pages.

Note the use of *italics* in the format

Article in a journal, paginated by volume:

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Article from an electronic database:

Author last name, first initials. (Date). Article Title. *Journal Title (or magazine/newspaper)*, volume (issue), pages (if available). Retrieved date, from Name of Data Base.

Magazine or Newspaper Article:

Author last name, first initials. (Year, Month and Day). Title of article. *Title of Magazine*, volume, pages. Note: Include section of newspaper if appropriate.

When referencing a book, if it is not the first edition then put (edition number) after the book's title

Book by One Author:

Author last name, first initials. (Date). Article Title. *Title of the Book*. Place:Publisher.

Edited Book:

Editors last name, first initials. (Date). (Ed. or Eds.). Article Title. *Title of the Book*. Place:Publisher.

Work in an Anthology or Collection of Essays:

Author last name, first initials. (Date). Essay Title. In First Initials, Last Name (Ed.), *Title of the Book* (pp. pages). Place:Publisher.

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If you are using a dictionary then site the author of the dictionary, also put in the edition number after the title.

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
